Firstly and most importantly, the finalists for the 2019 New Zealand Book Awards for Children & Young Adults have just been announced.

And in one little extra bit of news which you may have missed, Radio New Zealand have launched Storytime, the country's first kiwi kids **audiobook** platform, featuring hundreds of **read alouds** from classic picture books to Young Adult novels. More will be added over the next few months.

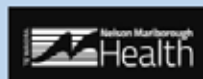
