Venue: Collingwood Area School

Date: Friday 14 June 2019

Times:

Arrive at CAS by 10.15am

Briefing and Welcome 10.30am

5 and 6 year olds walk around their track 10.40am, race immediately after.

Senior races begin shortly after the juniors are underway.

Parents need to be at CAS by 10.30 if they wish to see their children race.

5 year boys / girls

6 year boys / girls

Prizegiving immediately after last race ends.

Buses leave CAS after prizegiving.

While waiting, children are asked to wait in the front of the field, near the skyclimber or playground. The tracks will be clearly marked with ropes and cones.

Groups will be marshalled to the start area prior to their races with announcements over the PA system. PLEASE LISTEN OUT CAREFULLY TO ANNOUNCEMENTS SO CHILDREN DO NOT MISS RACES.

Please remind children to bring appropriate warm clothing for before and after their events.

Runners will need to wear suitable shoes. Due to the nature of the course it will not be safe to run in bare feet.

A sausage sizzle (\$2 per sausage) will be for sale throughout the day from outside the staffroom. Cold bottled water will be available to purchase at a cost of \$1.50. A healthy snack of popcorn will also be available for purchase. Please encourage students to bring some money to support our fundraising efforts. Older students should eat before their races, while the younger students run and vice versa.
