The model for which the Education Review Office (ERO) evaluates schools has had a significant makeover. You may recall the previous model where a team of reviewers would visit the school and evaluate effectiveness against a set of predetermined criteria. This model was widely criticised as a “one size fits all” model and provided little constructive feedback for effective school development. CAS has welcomed a new operating model and we are several months into our review.

We have one dedicated Evaluative Partner and have met now three times since February. I am joined by Brendan Richards from our Board of Trustees with our Evaluator to form our team. Over the period of the three meetings we have discussed our current position and looked at our strategic planning in terms of school wide development. We then collaborated to focus on one particular focus. The key question we will focus on (draft) is: “How effectively do teachers build positive relationships for learning?”

Once the focus is confirmed by ERO we will look at evidence gathering and once that is completed set some goals around our findings. The BOT can at that point report back to our community around that progress. As a team we then co construct the next focus of the review and the process begins again. We very much welcome this model of review.

Garry Lewis will be on extended sick leave from Thursday 10 June. He will be undergoing surgery in Christchurch followed by a period of treatment. We have been aware of this for quite some time and have the steady and familiar hand of Simon Graves stepping in to cover Garry's classes. I am sure you all join me in wishing Garry all the best for a successful operation and recovery.

## Sport Tasman

Next term Sport Tasman will be circulating an online survey with secondary school students (Year 7 - 13) across the region. The following information will explain how and why we are conducting the survey at Collingwood Area School.

### **Why are we surveying Rangatahi (Young People)?**

Young people are important to us, and experiences during secondary school years can inspire or discourage a life-long involvement in physical activity. We want to ensure that rangatahi have great sport, physical activity and active recreation experiences at school and the more you know about a population group, the better placed you are to provide opportunities and experiences that meet their needs, ultimately supporting a lifelong love of being active - we need to be making decisions that are informed by the audience who we are looking to cater for.

### **Why will the survey be in schools?**

We want to find out what more can be done to support schools and teachers, and link schools to sport and recreation organisations in their communities. We are targeting secondary schools from across the country, so we have information from a cross-section of rangatahi across New Zealand. We want to survey all secondary school students and school is the best place to reach young people.

### **Do schools have a say in how and when the survey is administered?**

Yes. The survey is circulated to students and is completed online. It is up to the school as to when and where the survey is completed. The survey has been set up, so it is easy for schools and students to take part at a time which is convenient for them.

### **Data Protection**

Students will have their say but will not be identifiable down to the individual level. There is a section at the end of the survey that asks participants to voluntarily provide their name, date of birth and postcode. These details will enable the responses to be combined with other data held by Sport NZ and/or other agencies (e.g. Statistics NZ), but will be removed once this done (i.e. individuals will not be able to be identified).
