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### Whenua Iti

#### **Environmental Science and Adventure Tourism**

Tena koutou katoa, I have been adventuring over to Whenua Iti for a series of three night blocks. This is an Outdoor Education place for young people to grow as a person, learning really cool things (while getting NCEA credits) with a pile of new people in nature. I have finished an environmental course where we learnt all about kaitiakitanga - being guardians of our environment by learning about species and how to restore or safekeep nature in a sustainable way. On our last block together our main focus was on volunteer work, such as tree planting, trapping and building penguin homes. The course that I'm on now is adventure tourism. 


All these types of books expose them to a style of language and writing that expands their vocabulary and shows them different ways to express themselves.


I have observed on quiz shows that usually the smartest contestants are the comedians because they are so widely read and observant.
