**New Books** this week are ready to reserve and pick up on Friday or Monday are more of your favorite series.

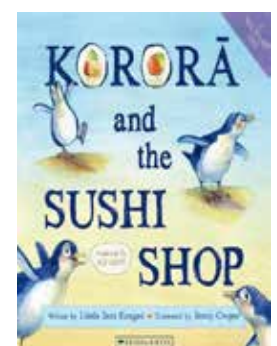
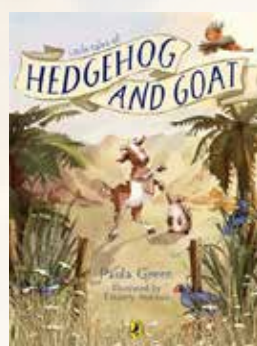
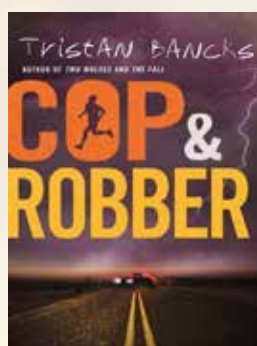
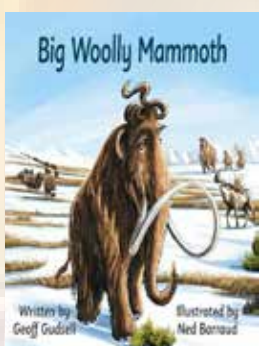
