## Study Leave

### Study Leave for Students in Years 11-13

To qualify for study leave, students in Years 11 to 13 must adhere to a set of criteria and complete several necessary steps. First and foremost, it is essential that students complete their sign-off sheets, which serve as a checklist for their progress and readiness to embark on study leave. These sheets should be meticulously reviewed by each teacher, ensuring that all internal assessments and coursework have been satisfactorily completed before endorsing a student's departure from their course.

In addition to academic requirements, students are also responsible for settling any outstanding obligations related to Chromebooks, library books, and office accounts. These accounts need to be cleared and signed off before students are eligible for study leave.

Lastly, the final decision regarding study leave lies with the secondary syndicate leader (myself), who will assess the student's eligibility based on the aforementioned criteria. Only after their approval will students be granted the privilege of study leave, allowing them to focus intensively on their upcoming examinations and academic commitments. This process is put in place to ensure that students are adequately prepared for their study leave period.

Each NCEA student has a study leave pass form that must be signed off by each subject teacher, Kaye and the Librarians before being returned to me for final approval. When approved by me, please show your form to the Admin team.

Please remember to bring your exam slips, pens and subject specific equipment such as calculators, rulers and coloured pencils. Students need to arrive at school 30 mins before the start of an exam.

## Library News

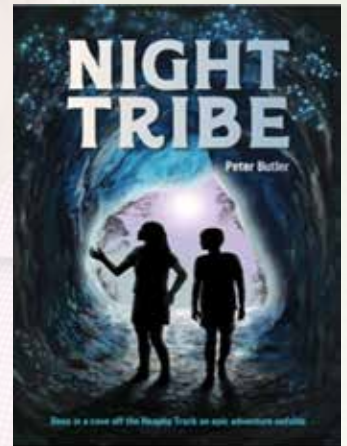
Welcome to our Library notes for the Flyer newsletter.

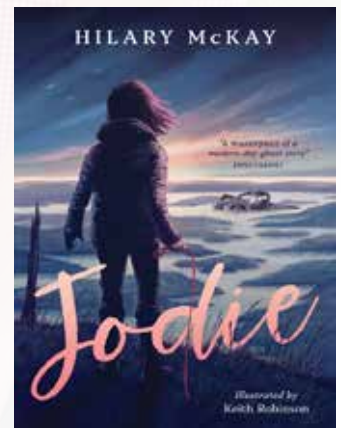
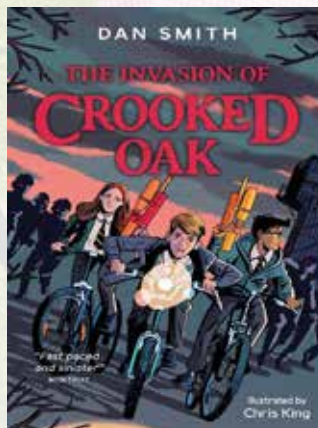
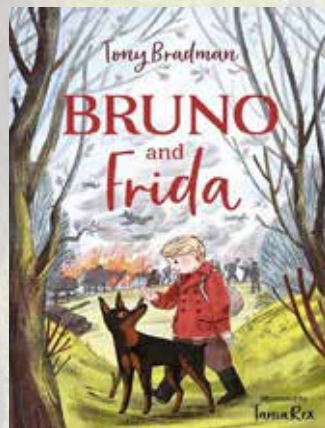
Special thanks to our library helpers Bonnie and Lynette-Rita they were little stars on the day.
