Dear Parents / Caregivers

In order to help our students make more connections to each other and our environment we have planned a team building day on Tuesday the 13th of Feb, based at Collingwood Beach. Students from years 7-13 will spend the day at the beach completing a range of activities. This will involve water based events so they will need to come prepared with togs and towel. Students are encouraged to wear their whānau colors so do not need to wear uniform. They will need water and food for the day.
