Asbestos in Coloured Sand - Ministry Advisory

Please send students to school with sun hats and water bottles. Sunscreen is available in the office if students need to top up.

The Ministry of Education has shared an important notice regarding several coloured sand products sold in New Zealand that have tested positive for asbestos. These items include EC Rainbow Sand, Creatistics Coloured Sand, and a number of "Magic Sand" and sandcastle products sold through Kmart. Details of the specific products were emailed to you earlier in the week. If you have purchased coloured sand for home use, please check the recall list and follow MBIE's clear advice: stop using these products immediately, secure them safely, and contact your local council for disposal guidance. We are sharing this information purely as a precaution to help keep our wider community informed. I can confirm that we do not have any of these products at school.





Meningitis

is on the rise again in New Zealand. The vaccine is free of charge to students entering Halls of Residence, or armed forces next year, and also to any students who turn 13 years of age while living

in boarding school hostels.

Meningitis strains covered are A,B,C,W&Y, 2 vaccines at first visit followed by a booster 8 weeks later. Ideally you would want to start mid-end November in order to get the booster dose before moving to new living situation.
