Kia ora e te whānau,

What a stunning start we have had to the 2026 school year. Our Mihi Whakatau was a truly special occasion - filled with warmth (despite the rain), mana, and a strong sense of belonging. It was wonderful to welcome new students, whānau, and staff into our kura in such a meaningful way. Even more, it has been an absolute pleasure to feel the energy and vibrancy of our students back on site. Schools are always quieter over the summer break, and the return of laughter, learning, and connection reminds us why this place is so special.

Prior to the Mihi Whakatau, we kicked off the term with a Student Leaders Day, which was a wonderful success. Student leaders worked together to clarify their roles, develop job descriptions, and begin planning individual leadership projects that will contribute positively to school life. They also organised a fantastic beach day for our Years 9–13 students - an event they hope will be full of connection, fun, and summer spirit. The House Leaders will be leading a learning opportunity about our new whānau names - **Tāne Mahuta**, **Papatūānuku** and **Tangaroa**. I am incredibly proud of the initiative and care this group has shown and wish them every success as they lead throughout 2026.



Another highlight of the opening week has been the Peer Mediator training led by Tracy Scott using The Peace Foundation programme. Both our senior and junior future mediators engaged thoughtfully in this learning, strengthening their ability to support positive relationships and resolve conflict in caring, respectful ways. We are proud of these students for stepping into leadership that truly makes a difference in the daily life of the school. Throughout our first days, teachers have loved settling back into their classrooms - preparing engaging learning environments, reconnecting with students, and setting the tone for a positive and successful year ahead. On a personal note, it was a privilege recently to travel to Murchison Area School alongside fellow TOSI principals to celebrate the pōwhiri for Charlotte Saunders as their new Principal. Charlotte was previously the Deputy Principal at Twizel Area School. Reconnecting with Twizel staff and students was very special, and it was inspiring to see Charlotte's hard work and leadership journey culminate in this new role.



A reminder to families of students in Year 9 and above that we warmly invite you to a short parent information afternoon in Week 3, on Wednesday at 3 pm. This 30–40-minute session is an opportunity to meet secondary teachers, learn how the secondary school is structured, and discuss pathways, assessment options, and learning support. You are welcome to bring your children.

Finally, I am very much looking forward to our swimming sports next week - always a highlight of Term 1 and a great way to celebrate participation, courage, and house spirit. Don't forget your house colours!

2026 Year 9 Rights of Passage

A Rite of passage is a ceremony used in many different cultures and marks important transitional periods in a person's life, such as birth, puberty, marriage, having children, and death.

Even though we are an Area school and we know these students, ka mauria mai he taonga, they bring with them a treasure, the treasure of growth and understanding that they can share with all of you as Year 9 students this year.




Now we have been at school for a week all those library books that were issued in December should be back to us now. Can you please help your child find and return those books.
